
Tell your neighbors and friends about us. Remember they only need to be Christian, not Catholic and all nationalities are welcome.



# **MOCK JATERNICE PATTIES**

1/2 lb. Ground Beef

1 Slice Bread

1/2 Tsp. Salt

1/2 Tsp. Allspice

1/3 Cup Milk

1 Egg

1 Small Onion

1/4 Tsp. Pepper

1/2 Tsp. Worcestershire Sauce

Little Garlic desired to taste

Place slices of bread under cold water tap until wet. Squeeze out water and crumble bread into meat. Combine ingredients with meat and mix well. Mixture will be quite moist.

Heat 1 tbsp. cooking oil at 340 degrees in electric skillet. Make patties and fry on both sides, 8 to 10 min., or until brown. Gravy can be made out of the fat left and served with rice. Also good with potatoes or dumplings with sauerkraut.

# BOHEMIAN ICE CREAM KOLACHKY

1 pt. ice cream

1 lb. butter or margarine

2 Tbsp. sugar

5 c. flour

filling (your choice)

Thaw ice cream and soften butter or margarine. Cream together. Add sugar and flour gradually. Refrigerate dough overnight. Roll out dough to 1/4-inch thickness. Cut in squares and fill with desired filling. Overlap opposite corners. Grease cookie sheet. Place in moderate oven and bake at 375° for 15 to 20 minutes, until cookies brown. Remove from oven and cool.

# CZECH DEVILED EGGS

Halve hard-boiled eggs lengthwise or crosswise. Cream the yolks, add dry mustard, salt, pepper, melted butter, vinegar or lemon juice to taste, mix thoroughly, and fill the whites with this.

# SEMAFOR (TRAFFIC LIGHT)

1 part griotka (Czech cherry brandy)

1 part zelena (Czech peppermint liqueur)

1 part vajecny konak (Czech eggnog cognac)

Fill the bottom of a shot glass with the griotka. Next, using the concave side of a spoon, pour the vajecny over the griotka (it should form a layer over the surface of the griotka). Last, carefully pour the zelena down the rim of the glass so that it settles atop the denser vajecny. Your drink should look like layers of red, yellow, and green. Enjoy!

# MINTY MELON POPS

5 cups honeydew, cantaloupe and watermelon balls

2 tablespoons lime zest (from 2 to 3 limes)

6 tablespoons lime juice (from the same 2 to 3 limes)

1/3 cup sugar

4 tablespoons finely chopped fresh mint leaves

12 (6-inch) bamboo skewers

In a large bowl, combine melon balls, lime zest, lime juice, sugar and mint. Refrigerate for 1 to 3 hours. Impale five melon balls, alternating colors, on each skewer and serve. Makes 12 skewers.

# July is National Hot Dog Month

Hot dogs are probably the best picnic and family gathering food ever because everyone from the grade schoolers to grandpa loves them.

If you love hot dogs, and you want the very best, tastiest hot dog for your summer fun, experts agree that tem-

perature is the most important consideration. Hot dogs must be hot enough but not too hot.

The optimum temperature for a hot dog is between 150 and 160



degrees. The temperature is key because hot dogs cooked at under 140 degrees will be spongy and dull tasting. Cooked over 165 degrees, they get bloated and quickly start to dry out.

Oscar Mayer recommends dropping the 10 hot dogs into boiling water; return to boil and cover. Remove from heat. Let stand 7 minutes or until the hot dogs are heated through.

According to Nielsen data, Americans bought 1 billion pounds of hot dogs in retail stores last year. The National Hot Dog and Sausage Council (NHDSC) estimates we'll consume 8 billion Hot Dogs between Memorial Day and Labor Day, and more than 19.4 million at ballpark concession stands during the 2017 Major League baseball season.

For many years, Catholics of Czech & Slovak heritage had the opportunity to attend Sunday Mass in their native language at Our Lady of Perpetual Help (O.L.P.H.) Church on East 61st Street in Manhattan.

After the termination of the Mass at O.L.P.H., one of the staunch Czech supporters, Vaclav Sedlacek met with Msgr. Heneghan, Pastor of Our Lady of Mount Carmel in Astoria to determine whether a Sunday Czech Mass could be held there. Msgr. Heneghan gave his approval and Rev. Alois Vyoral traveled every Sunday from New Rochelle to Astoria to say the Mass in the lower church. Fr. Vyoral served the Czech parishioners for about 20 years. He was followed by Fr. Kotvrda (1996-1999), Fr. Antonin Kocurek (1999-2009), Fr. Jan Czudek (2007-2011) and once again Fr. Antonin Kocurek (2011 to present).

For social gatherings St. Martin's festival (Martinske Posviceni) was started. This was held in November and traditionally was a festival for all in small villages.

Also, a pre-Lenten Sunday festival was arranged. The first festival had over 500 persons attending.

With the young members having a need for social life, soccer and volleyball teams were arranged.

Over the years as the younger generation matured, they moved away and the attendance fell off somewhat.

With the continued need for a Czech Mass and fellowship, 30-50 persons gather each Sunday for the 10:30 a.m. Mass followed by coffee and baked treats in the auditorium.

We pray that this tradition continues.

# IT'S THE BERRIES

The season's red and blue bounty can help you stay in the pink. In recent studies, three half-cup servings of strawberries per week lowered heart attack risk by a

third, and a daily cup of blue berries improved cognitive performance.

It is high summer in the Czech Republic, a time when all sorts of fruit are ripening and ready for pick-

ing.

Gardens are full of colour now as various berries are just ready for picking. Most often you will find strawberries - jahody, raspberries maliny, less often blackberries -



a lof of red currants - cerveny rybiz, and black currants - cerny rybiz. Another traditional garden berry is the gooseberry - angrest which now seems to
be losing popularity.

Summer is also the time of forest berries. There are boruvky - blueberries, which get their Czech name from the pine tree - borovice. They are abundant especially in higher altitudes. There are wild strawberries - lesni jahody which translates as forest or wood strawberries.

August is the only time when you can enjoy summer apples - letni jablka - small green apples which taste lovely and fresh, but don't keep and often go bad when they're still on the tree. These apples are sometimes called padavky from the verb padat - to fall because they fall from the apple tree before they are picked.



# A Czech Pub Classic

The local pub is the gathering place of working class men, the after-work place where many important life decisions are talked over and made. Sitting on the bar in a place of honor near the tap is a jar of pickled hot dogs, onions, and spices called utopenci, "drowned men."

The name comes from a tragic ending for a Mr. Samanek, a Czech pub owner who invented the pickled hot dogs and served them to his patrons 100 years ago. They were very popular, making his pub famous throughout the country (and because they were accompanied by wonderful Czech beer, their popularity soared). In a horrible twist of fate, Mr. Samanek drowned one day as he was repairing his mill's wheel. His famous sausages were named "drowned men" in his memory. Today, utopenci are a staple in all Czech pubs, just like our peanuts or popcorn in our bars.

# Utopenci "Drowned Men"

2 1/2 cups water

1 1/2 cups white vinegar

10 whole pepper corns

4 pieces allspice

1 bay leaf

2 lbs. thick hot dogs (garlics)

1 tsp. salt

1/2 tsp. sugar

5 cloves garlic

4 or 5 big onions

Method: Mix the water, vinegar, salt, sugar and spices. Bring to a boil, and boil for 2 minutes. Then let the liquid cool. Peel the hot dogs. Slice the onions into rings. Prepare a 2 liter jar. Layer the onions, garlic, and hot dogs with the onions last at the top of the jar. Pour the lukewarm liquid into the jar, including the spices. Shake the jar to get rid of bubbles. Seal the jar, and refrigerate for 2 weeks.



St. Procop was born about 985 in Bohemia. His name is of Greek origin and means "a man who makes progress in work." He went to the fine school of Vysehrad, in Prague, and was ordained a priest. He desired a solitary life, so he went to a monastery and later became a hermit. His home was the beautiful Sazava forest. Procop's wisdom, holiness and the fact that he was a priest drew people to him. In the year 1030, King Oldrich made Procop his trusted advisor. At the king's urging, Procop founded the first Slavonic Abbey in Bohemia. After erecting a church at the Abbey of Sazava, Procop immediately erected a school. He served at the Abbey until his death in March 1053. On July 4, 1204, Procop was declared a Saint of the Church by Pope Innocent III. St. Procop was the first saint of Czech nationality. He is the Patron Saint of Artisans, Craftsmen and Tillers of the Soil. His feastday is July 4.

# JAN NERUDA



Jan Neruda was born in Praha, on July 9, 1834, son of a poor family. He became a writer of poetry, prose, travel sketches and novels.

He studied languages and history at Charles University of Prague. He became a schoolteacher, but gave up teaching to become a journalist.

In Neruda's volume of

poems, "Cemetery Blossoms" (1857), there are indications of his being swayed by his youthful pessimistic feelings. But he did show originality, sincerity and a broad humanitarian outlook on life. His "Pisne Kosmicke" (Cosmic Songs, 1878), prove that he was interested in outer space and that he often pondered over the mysteries of the universe.

In 1872, Neruda published "Obrazy z ciziny" (Pictures from Abroad). He had a keen sense of observing people and viewed what he saw with a good sense of humor.

In 1883, Neruda published "Ballads and Romances," considered his best work. The verses are based spiritually on Czech folk motives.

Neruda's last collection "Zpevy Patecni" (Friday Songs), as in his first work, are lyrical with patriotic fervor, mystic ideas combined with pensive reflective words and sorrowful hymns. They show religious feelings of love for his Czechs.

His "Povidky Malostranske" (Tales of the Little Quarter) is considered first among Prague's classics. It is a book of short stories written from his memories of the people who were his neighbors and with whom he had spent 36 of his 57 years of life.

When he died in 1891, the people, grieving for their famous son, wanted him to be put into a vault in the Vysehrad Cemetery. Anna Haralik, his house-keeper who had lovingly cared for him in his long and painful illness, and many good friends who did not want him laid away against his wishes fought so hard that his wishes to be buried in Czech soil were carried out.

# Alfons Mucha

Alfons Mucha was born in 1860 in Ivancice, Moravia. Despite having great artistic talent, the Prague Academy of Fine arts did not accept him.

After designing a poster advertisement for Sarah Bernhardt, theatre star, he was hired to design more posters, set designs and costumes. From then he became well known. Mucha spent some time in America, teaching and painting numerous portraits. He

returned to Prague in 1910. In 1918, he designed postage stamps and the bank notes for the new Czechoslovak state.

At the same time, he designed a stained glass window for St. Vitus' Cathedral in Prague. In 1938, the Germans invaded Bohemia. Mucha was among the first to be arrested by the Gestapo. He eventually returned home, but his health never recovered. Mucha died in Prague on July 14, 1939 and is buried in te Vysehrad Cemetery.



# Woody Guthrie

Woody Guthrie was born in Oklahoma on July 14, 1912. He wrote lyrics for almost 3,000 songs, he published two novels and wrote many poems, plays, newspaper articles and letters.

### This Land is Your Land

This land is your land, this land is my land From California to the New York Island; From the Redwood Forest, to the Gulf Stream waters

This land was made for you and me.

As I was walking that ribbon of highway. I saw above me that endless skyway; I saw below me that golden valley; This land was made for you and me.

In his late 30s, Woody began to act strangely. He had a disease that sometimes made him moody or violent. His mother had also suffered from the disease. Doctors discovered that Huntington's disease was causing his odd behavior. He died in 1967 in a hospital in New York. He was just 55 years old.
