





JUBILEE YEAR OF HOPE





THE EASTER RABBIT HAS MANY FRIENDS

Over a hundred years ago, Beatrice Potter wrote a story about four rabbits, Flopsy, Mopsy, Cottontail and Peter. This story has grown into one of the most popular children's stories ever written, "The Tale of Peter Rabbit." Here are some other famous rabbits:

BUGS BUNNY – Who can be more popular than good Old "Bugsy?" He comes from Warner Bros. Studios inHollywood and was first cast as a rather ugly creature in a 1938 Porky Pig cartoon. That changed quite a bit. He is a rascal of a rabbit who went on to become a star.

THUMPER – This furry friend came about in 1942 when he joined Bambi and other forest creatures in a Walt Disney production.

VELVETEEN RABBIT – Here is a stuffed rabbit who comforts a sick child in a very touching story by Margery Williams in 1922. Because the rabbit is believed, he was turned into a real live rabbit.

BR'ER RABBIT – Another rabbit Walt Disney made popular by featuring him in the 1946 movie, "Song of the South." This rabbit, something like Bugs Bunny, always comes out ahead when in silly situations.

ROGER RABBIT – Roger is a not-so-nice unemployed, long-eared creature who came about in a 1988 movie.

PETER COTTONTAIL – This Peter can be found in the song, "Here Comes Peter Cottontail, hopping down the bunny trail, hippity hoppity Easter's on its way." The song was recorded in 1950 by Gene Autry, who also recorded "Rudolph the Red-Nosed Reindeer."

HARE AND THE TORTOISE – After boasting of his speed, this rabbit feels pretty sheepish when he is beaten by a slowpoke of a turtle.

LITTLE BUNNY FU-FU – This mischievous bunny is warned by the Good Fairy to stop his antics or she will turn him into a goon. He did not listen, so came about the saying, "Hare today, goon tomorrow."

EASTER RABBIT – It is thought customs revolving around the Easter Rabbit were brought to this country by German immigrants in the 18th century. Fires were often burnt on Easter Eve and it was said they were caused by the Easter hare (rabbit) who was making dyes by burning wildflowers to be used for coloring eggs.

THE ENERGIZER RABBIT – Who does not know him? He is the rabbit on the Energizer batteries who just keeps going and going and going.



ST. GEORGE'S BASILICA (BAZILIKA SV. JIRI)



This basilica is the oldest surviving church building within Prague Castle, located in Prague, Czech Republic. The construction of the church was started by Vratislaus I in 920. It is dedicated to St. George. There is a bas-relief (carving in which the design stands out from the surface) on the outside of the church which represents St. George and the dragon.

At the time of Vratislaus' death in February 921, the church had been completed but not yet consecrated. Wenceslaus I completed the project and upon the death of his grandmother, Ludmila of Bohemia, in September 921, Wenceslaus buried Ludmila there. The basilica is part of the Prague castle complex of buildings. The castle was the political capital of the nation and the basilica was part of the spiritual center.

In 1962, the building was declared a national cultural monument and converted into a concert hall. Between 1969 and 1975, it was converted into an exhibition space. The building now houses the 19th century Bohemian Art Collection of National Gallery Prague and still serves as a concert hall.

Internet Safety is your Responsibility

Who cares the most about your individual Cyber Security? The answer is simple: YOU! It is my belief that despite all the claims from cyber security software and personnel, it all comes down to you.

Now, what's the #1 piece of information that can identify you? That one item is your Social Security Number (SSN). Allow me to give you just a small list of where your personal identification (SSN) is already stored. The small list is as follows:

- the IRS
- the Social Security Administration
- vour doctor's office
- Medicare and or Medicaid
- any additional health insurance
- the motor vehicles agency
- credit card issuers
- Your Bank and/or Credit Union
- your insurance company

Again, this is just a partial list. Why am I telling you this? Because many of the above institutions have already been breached by cyber pirates and many times a multitude of Social Security Numbers have been stolen.



As we have said before in these articles, cyber thieves aren't interested in your credit card anymore, they are interested in being you. Yes identity theft. Once they pretend to be you and have the necessary information that can back that up, they can go about and empty your bank account or establish a new loan or line of credit thereby making you liable. Often times you will not be aware of this for some time after it happens.

So what can you do to protect yourself. Well here's a list:

- Learn how to spot SCAMS in your email inbox and on your Phone
- Freeze your credit using the three main credit bureaus: Experian, Equifax & TransUnion
- Talk to your banker and learn how to protect the money that's already in your accounts. For example, there are ways to prevent money from leaving your account without notifying you first. There are other ways to limit the amount of money that leaves an account per day.
- Get the phone app from your bank and mortgage company. Learn to use it even if you have to get your 10 year old niece or nephew to help you.

These suggestions put a great deal of responsibility onto you. But then again that's where things are heading. You can do it! It just takes a little time and confidence but believe me you can do it.

We are a large Society and have a great group of members.



World War Il

Dear Abby: I'd like to bring to light the unheralded act of some residents of the Czech city of Plzen. On May 7, 1945, the day World War II was declared over, we of the 23rd Cavalry Reconnaissance Squadron (Mechanized) arrived in Plzen. A 20-mile buffer zone was established between us and the advancing Russian forces, then in Slovakia. An envoy was established to meet with the Russian military.

While the envoy was gone, those of us left behind in Plzen got acquainted with the Czech people. Some of them learned that none of us had had showers during the prior 40 days.

A group of citizens set up a program to open their bathrooms to soldiers on an assembly-line rotation. When my turn came I was ushered into a residence to an immaculate bathroom with a spotlessly clean tub filled with 8 inches of warm water, I was not rushed but carefully timed, so they could prepare the tub for the next soldier.



ARCADE CLEVELAND

The Arcade Cleveland was America's inaugural indoor shopping center. At a cost of \$875,000, the arcade opened in May 1890. At the time of its opening it was known as Cleveland's Crystal Palace. The structure is two nine-story buildings joined by a five-story arcade with a glass spanning over three hundred feet along four balconies. It was the city's first building to be listed on the National Register of Historic Places.



CHURCH OF ST. MICHAEL THE ARCHANGEL KOSTEL SV. MICHAELA ARCHANDELA



This church is located on a hill above Vitochov village, located about 70 miles southwest of Prague. The name means "who is like God." It is considered one of the oldest churches in Moravia. The exact date of its foundation is not clear, but it is known that the church existed in the 13th century. This church is protected as a cultural monument of the Czech Republic.



Scrivan

Have duckling quartered. Rub skin with salt. Add tablespoon of caraway seed. Roast in shallow pan, uncovered with a little water at 325 degrees for 1½-2 hours. Pour off excess fat. Baste frequently, adding water if needed. Increase temperature to 400 degrees for another 20 minutes or until duck is tender and browned. If skin is getting too brown, cover with foil. 





The Sense of a Goose

If we have as much sense as geese, we will stand by each other in difficult times as well as when we are strong.

As each goose flap its wings, it creates an "uplift" for the birds that follow. By flying in a "V" formation, the whole flock add 71% greater flying range and if each bird flew alone.

People who share common direction and sense of community can get where they're going quicker and easier because they're traveling on the thrust of each other.

When a goose falls out of formation, it suddenly feels the drag and resistance of flying alone. It quickly moves back into formation to take advantage of the lifting power of the bird immediately in front of it.

If we have as much sense as a goose, we stay information with those headed where they want to go. We are willing to accept their help and give our help to others.

When the lead bird tires, it rotates to the back of the formation to take advantage of the lifting power of the birds in front of it.

It pays to take, turns doing the hard tasks and sharing leadership. As with geese, people are interdependent on each other, skills, capabilities, and unique arrangements of gifts, talents, or resources.

The geese flying information honk to encourage those upfront to keep up their speed.

We need to make sure our honking is encouraging. In groups, where there is encouragement, the production is much greater. The power of encouragement (to stand by one's own heart or values, and also encourage the heart and values of others) is the quality of honking we seek.


When a goose gets sick, wounded, or shut down, two geese drop out of formation and follow it down to help and protect it. They stay with it until it dies, or is able to fly again. Then, they launch out with another formation or catch up with the flock.

If we have as much sense as goose we will stand by
